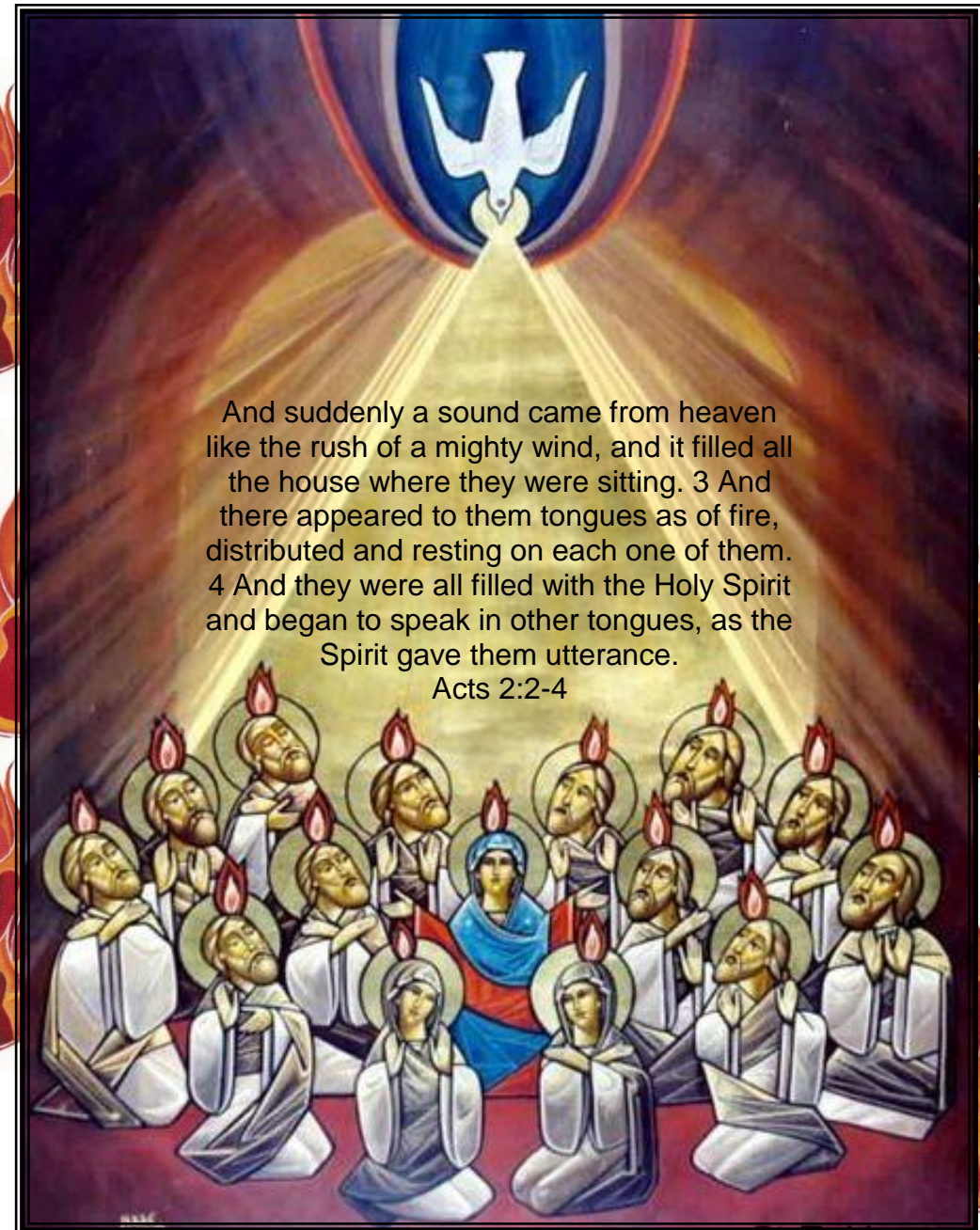

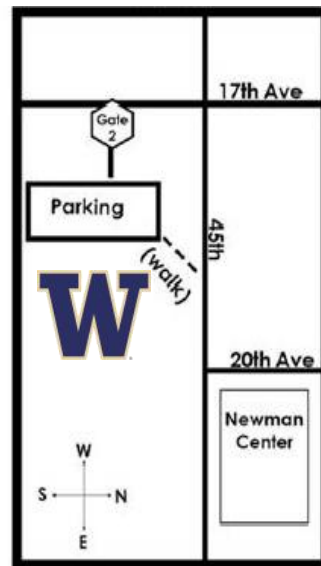

Bl. Cardinal Newman Letter Officially Dedicated

Through the generosity of Nicholas Scheetz and the Scheetz Family, a letter written by Cardinal Newman himself was dedicated last week and hung in the chapel near the sacristy door. The letter was written when Cardinal Newman was head of the Oratory in England, and is in response to a student's father who was concerned about his son's placement in a school academic competition. The gift is an inspiring reminder of Cardinal Newman's patronage over our ministry here at the UW.



The letter was given in honor of Elizabeth Brier Scheetz, the mother of Mr. Scheetz, who lived in the Newman Center's Women's house in 1939. This is a truly special gift to our community. Please join us in thanking the Scheetz family, and take a moment to view this incredible piece of history.
